Senior Pastors Report

*"Jabez was the one who prayed to the God of Israel, 'Oh, that you would bless me and expand my territory! Please be with me in all that I do, and keep me from all trouble and pain!' And God granted him his request."

As we reflect on the year behind us and look ahead with expectancy, this prayer of Jabez beautifully captures the heart of what God has done at Harvest Community Church in 2025. From the very beginning of this year, our desire has been simple yet bold—that God would bless what He has established here, expand the territory of our influence, keep His hand upon us, and protect and guide us in all we do. We can confidently say, just as Scripture declares, that God granted that request.

Shekina and I continue to be humbled by the opportunity to pastor this great church and witness the transformation taking place in people's lives. This year, God reminded us once again that the church is not built by human effort alone, but by God's favor, presence, and power. In 2025, we experienced tangible evidence of the Lord expanding our territory—spiritually, numerically, and in our reach beyond the four walls of the church.

God's blessing was evident across every ministry of Harvest. Lives were changed, families were strengthened, and hope was restored. As Jabez prayed, the hand of the Lord was truly with us.

Here are just a few highlights of what God did this year:

- **Sunday Attendance** – We averaged 520 people on Sundays (up 13%).
- **Water Baptisms** – 40 people were baptized.
- **Food Closet** – 1,500 bags of food were given away to people in need.
- **Easter Weekend** – 1,109 people attended our four Sunday services and Good Friday service. Fifty hands were raised for salvation, there were 60 first-time visitors, and over 200 volunteers served.
- **Embrace Grace** – 4 mothers chose life instead of death.
- **New Harvest Members** – 39 people made a commitment to officially join Harvest and make this church their home.
- **YouTube Channel** – Total sermon views reached 12,157. Views increased by 180%, and new subscribers were up 32%. Our most-watched sermon series was *The Parables*.

As we look back, we are reminded that every number represents a person, and every person has a story of God's faithfulness. None of this would be possible without the prayers, generosity, and unwavering commitment of our Harvest family. You are not simply members—you are partners in ministry, co-laborers in the work God is doing here.

Thank you for trusting us, believing in the vision, and walking this journey of faith together. We look ahead with faith and expectation for all that God has in store.

Missions Report

In 2025, Harvest Community Church continued to give faithfully and generously. This year, we were honored to support 54 missionaries and ministries through monthly partnerships and special offerings, investing a total of \$81,945.31. Every dollar given reflects our shared commitment to see the gospel proclaimed and lives transformed across the world.

Throughout the year, we stayed closely connected with our missionaries through newsletters, phone calls, emails, and in-person visits. Their stories consistently reminded us that God is moving powerfully across the nations.

We began the year encouraged by a visit from missionaries Shannell and David Hsueh, serving in Taiwan—a nation of more than 23 million people, where only 6.8% identify as Christian. Their perseverance, and heart for reaching the people of Taiwan stirred our faith and set a hopeful tone for the year.



A highlight of the year came in April, when a small team from Harvest, led by Stephen Martinez, traveled to the Patagonia region in Argentina to serve our long-term missionaries, Eddie and Diana Echevarria. During our time at the Patagonian Bible Institute, the team supported the ministry through technical and video work, outdoor maintenance, preaching, and intentional relationship-building with students and staff.

One of the most meaningful moments for me personally was witnessing the students' deep passion for Jesus. Their joy in worship and eagerness to pursue God left a lasting impression on our team. Even though we come from different cultures and speak different languages, the unity we experienced in worship and mission was evident. It was a vivid reminder that the global Church truly is one family.

Here at home, Harvest continued to bless missionary families staying in the Mission Villa homes in Roseville. Through the Welcome Back baskets and Christmas baskets, we sought to refresh and encourage those who pour out so much in their fields of service. These simple acts of hospitality have become a meaningful way for our church to care for missionaries during their itineration seasons.

As we look back on 2025, we do so with deep gratitude. Thank you, Harvest family, for your faithful prayers, consistent generosity, and heart to see the Good News advance. Because of your partnership, missionaries and ministries around the world are strengthened, encouraged, and equipped to continue the work God has called them to do. Together, we are helping fulfill the Great Commission — from Roseville to the ends of the earth.

MINISTRY REPORT

This past year has been a powerful reminder of God's faithfulness in our Next-Gen Ministry. From our infants to our graduating seniors, we have watched God move in ways that shape identity, strengthen faith, and build a foundation that will carry the next generation for years to come. In a culture that speaks so loudly, we remain committed to creating an environment where kids and students can encounter Jesus, grow in biblical truth, and experience authentic community. As we look back on 2025, we celebrate the moments—big and small—that have marked spiritual growth, deepened relationships, and reminded us why investing in the next generation is one of the greatest callings we have as a church.

This year has been marked by growth, consistency, and God's favor in our Children's and Youth Ministry. Across every age group, our ministry centered on four key priorities:

- Cultivating strong, meaningful relationships with our kids
- Teaching Scripture in ways that are clear, practical, and easy to apply
- Creating experiences that consistently point students to Jesus
- Hosting fun, memorable events that help shape lifelong positive church memories

Some of the most meaningful highlights from this year in our children's ministry were found in the small, everyday moments. Watching our kids worship with such sincerity was incredibly special. Week after week, they came eager to learn, asking thoughtful and insightful questions as they engaged with the lessons. We also witnessed beautiful friendships form—connections that helped our kids feel known, included, and truly part of our church family. Pastor Sarah Zamora has done a phenomenal job leading our Kids Ministry team, and our volunteers continue to serve with such joy and excellence.



Our youth ministry reflected that same spirit. We are blessed with an incredible youth worship team, and together we've created an atmosphere of powerful worship every Wednesday night. It has been deeply rewarding to watch students step into leadership—praying for one another, sharing messages, and caring for each other in ways that show genuine spiritual maturity. The community they've built is real, supportive, and rooted in their growing faith. Thanks to the generosity of our church family, we were able to provide scholarships to more than 20 students for summer camp, taking a total of over 50 students. Every year, we stand in awe of how much God can do in just a few days. One of the students who received a scholarship began a relationship with the Lord at camp, and just this past Sunday, we had the privilege of baptizing him. One kid, one student at a time—every moment matters. We celebrate every opportunity to help our kids and teens move toward a sincere, lasting relationship with Christ.

It's easy to feel the weight of the challenges facing this generation, but Matthew 13 reminds us of the Parable of the Sower—Jesus tells a story about a farmer who scatters seed, and the seed lands on four different types of soil. Each soil represents a different kind of heart response to God's Word. As we look at our Next-Gen ministry, we are encouraged to know that the seed is landing on good soil. Week after week, kids and teens are hearing the Word of God, and it is taking root in their hearts. We see their faith growing, and we believe wholeheartedly that they will do incredible things for Jesus. We believe God is raising up a generation who will love Him wholeheartedly and follow Him faithfully. It is one of our greatest honors to walk with them as they discover who God is, who they are in Him, and the purpose He has for their lives.



None of this would be possible without our amazing volunteers in both the Kids and Youth Ministries. Thank you for your faithfulness—from nursery to toddlers, preschool to elementary, and all the way through youth. Much of what you do happens behind the scenes and may feel small at times, but please never underestimate how God uses your consistency and love. What you pour into these children and teens carries eternal value. A special thank you to Anthony Petrucelli. Thank you for all you do behind the scenes to help build our youth ministry.

It is a privilege to serve at Harvest Community Church alongside our staff, official board, and church family. This past year was amazing, and now we are excited and expectant for all that 2026 will bring.

MINISTRY REPORT

I am deeply thankful for yet another year serving at Harvest Community Church. It is truly a privilege to be part of this incredible body of believers. Year after year, I continue to be in awe of what God is building in and through this church—lives being transformed, faith being strengthened, and people stepping into their God-given calling.

As we reflect on this past year, we are proud to highlight the intentional strengthening of our discipleship pathway. In 2025, we officially launched the Foundations Class, marking the beginning of a new discipleship bedrock for our church. This class was created to clearly answer essential questions for every believer: *What does it mean to follow Jesus? How do we connect with the Holy Spirit? How do we continue to grow as disciples?*

This year, we successfully hosted two Foundations classes, each serving as an entry point for new believers and a re-grounding opportunity for those who have followed Christ for years. These gatherings were more than informational—they were formational. Participants engaged Scripture, explored core Christian beliefs, and were equipped with practical next steps for spiritual growth. The feedback has been deeply encouraging, confirming a clear hunger for biblical depth, clarity, and intentional discipleship.

Foundations now serve as a foundational layer within Harvest's broader ministry strategy. Rather than assuming spiritual maturity or relying on informal growth alone, this class establishes a shared language, theology, and expectation for what it means to be a disciple of Jesus at Harvest. It has begun shaping how we think about next steps, leadership development, and long-term spiritual health within our church body.

In addition to the in-person classes, we also began developing an online Foundations experience. While still in its early stages, this initiative opens the door to new possibilities—serving those who are unable to attend in person, preparing individuals before entering groups or ministry teams, and providing an on-demand discipleship resource for future seasons. As we look ahead, we see strong potential for this online platform to expand access, improve consistency, and support growth both within our church and beyond our walls.

As we move into 2026, we are filled with faith and expectation for what God will continue to build. With growth comes opportunity—and with opportunity comes need. We are actively praying for more leaders, teachers, and volunteers who feel called to help disciple others, facilitate Foundations classes, mentor new believers, and invest in the spiritual formation of our church family. Discipleship is not a program; it is a shared calling.

We are grateful for what God has done this year and excited for what lies ahead. The launch of Foundations is only the beginning, and we believe the seeds planted in 2025 will bear fruit for many years to come as Harvest continues to grow deeper, stronger, and more rooted in Christ.

This past year has been a meaningful season of outreach for our church, marked by a growing commitment to loving our community well. As we stepped out in faith together, we saw how compassion and consistency can build genuine connections and reflect Christ's heart to those around us.



The Food Closet ministry outreach is possible because of the faithful giving of our Harvest family, the incredible National Charity League, and our faithful Harvest volunteers who volunteer each month! We provided food for approximately 533 families, representing 1,679 adults and 677 children in 2025. We are so grateful for the privilege of connecting and praying for these individuals each month. Our Food Closet participants submitted prayer requests throughout the year with our prayer team. As a team, we faithfully prayed for our participants each month. We also made follow-up connections with some participants who came through the food line. We called them during the week and prayed with them. We encouraged them to join us on Sunday and offered prayer and support where they needed it.

Each month provides a different opportunity for the Lord to move. This year, many families in our community lost important benefits that helped keep them financially stable. We were grateful to offer support and pray with those facing hardship during this challenging time. Many of the participants who come through our Food Closet are elderly. It is a joy to visit with them, remember their names, and remind them how much Jesus loves them! During the holiday season, we provide holiday meal bags, and Safeway gift cards. Thank you for your faithful support of this ministry at Harvest Community Church!

The Angel Tree families who attended the party were grateful for everything Harvest did. Harvest Community Church continually goes above and beyond to show the love of Jesus to our community. It is an honor to be part of what we get to do together!
